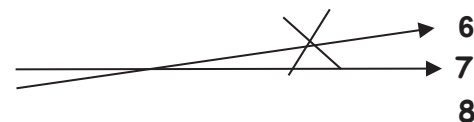

Mackinac Island is a wonderful summer resort. You have a place to leave your routine and discover the rhythm of waves. You have an Island where the automobile never replaced the horse and carriage. Carriagemen officially began providing tours of the Island in 1869. The founders of Mackinac Island Carriage Tours have had a very prominent role in making Mackinac Island Michigan's most popular tourist attraction.

-Getting to Mackinac Island: There are ferry services. Moreover, Pellston Airport is approximately fifteen miles from the island.

-Getting around: No cars? No problem. You will find over 1,500 bikes to rent on Mackinac Island. You will also find electric scooters, tandems for the romantics, wheelchairs for the elderly and disabled as well as boat rides.

-What to do: You will never find yourself without something to do here. You will be able to experience the community's history at museums and historic sites, explore the natural beauty of the Island's parks and much more. Plenty of museums are located throughout the community, as for example Surrey Hills Museum. You will find establishments focused on a number of subjects, from the arts to the history of carriages.

-Tour The Island: A popular way to get a closer look at the Island and its history is on horse-drawn carriage tours, where you will be led by a well-informed guide. There are plenty of walking tours available. The Mackinac Island State Park, which covers more than 80% of the Island, is open for your exploration. In addition, touring Mackinac by bicycle is easy.

-Water Activities And Sports: At Mackinac Island, boating tours are available ranging from sailboats to kayaks. Visitors can also spend a relaxing day fishing on the Straits of Mackinac. If you prefer your sports on the comfort of dry land, the Island offers uniquely designed golf courses.

-Restaurants and shopping : The cuisine of Mackinac Island is as diverse as the Island itself. From the historic hotels and their world-renowned chefs, to the little eateries that offer something quick and comforting like a slice of pizza or a burger. The Island is a shopper's paradise. Shops can be found Downtown, Market Street, in many hotels and at Surrey Hill.

-Fudge Festival : For more than a century, Mackinac Island's fudge has been an institution that's become famous worldwide. Fudge devotees are known as "*fudgies*" – a term that is also synonymous with Northern Michigan tourists. The Mackinac Island Fudge Festival takes place each August. Fudge is made fresh each day at Mackinac's multitude of fudge shops.
